### **DEQ REQUESTS COMMENTS ON THE DRINKING WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND PROPOSED AMENDMENT #1 TO THE SFY 2010 INTENDED USE PLAN**

The Water Quality Division of the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) requests comments on the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund's (DWSRF) Proposed Amendment #1 to the SFY 2010 Intended Use Plan (IUP). A public meeting on the original SFY 2010 IUP and Priority List was held Monday, June 22, 2009. The Intended use plan outlines uses of the capitalization grant from EPA and State funds and lists the projects as ranked for funding by the Priority Ranking System. DEQ proposes to add projects that have requested placement on the Project Priority List (PPL) using available funds.

The Drinking Water State Revolving Fund was made possible by the passage of the Safe Drinking Water Act Amendments of 1996. The act authorized funds to be used by states to establish a revolving loan fund to address drinking water infrastructure needs and correct other water system deficiencies that might result in violations of drinking water standards. Federal law requires the public be given the opportunity to comment on the proposed plan.

The act authorized funds to be used by states to establish a revolving loan fund to address drinking water infrastructure needs and correct other water system deficiencies, which might result in violations of drinking water standards. Federal law requires the public be given the opportunity to comment on the proposed plan.
